With the fall of '34 came the inspiring realization that at last we were "upper classmen." Then came a sad piece of news—the juniors would not be allowed to go on the excursion trip to Washington. This was to be a privilege granted to "Seniors Only." But we consoled ourselves with a huge junior outing at Cherokee. Remember how it rained, and how a few hardy (or foolish) ones went swimming anyway? Remember all the good eats, the charades, the big square dance in the pavilion, and (I blush to mention it) the talking contest.

September, 1935—at last we were seniors! We had reached the dizzy height! Our first public appearance as Seniors was in our Christmas chapel program, when paper snow fell in such abundance that it practically obliterated the whole class.

After the Christmas holidays we held our last class election and chose for president Rollin Post, for vice-president, James Rhea, for secretary, Virginia Parrish, for treasurer, Barclay McGhee, and for sergeant-at-arms, Norman "Bus" Masengill. After much palaver and pow-wow, graduation invitations were selected, the traditional Mardi Gras was replaced by (quote) "three outstanding educational programs" (unquote), heated argument arose concerning the senior play; and so the class of '36 swung into the home stretch of the twelve-year course, running true to form, in an excited, half-eager, half-reluctant manner.

The way has been long, sometimes hard, but we are beginning to understand the wistful expression that, in years past, we have often observed on the faces of other seniors who were standing where we now stand. We, in turn, realize that graduation means, also, "goodbye," that our school days are truly history, and that we must face the future without the protection of our beloved Tennessee High. So, classmates, fare-well—don't remember the hard things that have happened while you were here; just remember the good times, the true friends, the place in your hearts that our school days have filled with memories sweet and dear—memories sad and sweet.

So, goodbye, dear old school, our home for five long years!



FOOTBALL REVIEW

This year Tennessee experienced only a mediocre season, winning five games and losing five. The Vikings rose to the heights when they held the highly touted Kingsport, Indians, Big Six Champions, to a 19-7 count.

During his second year, Coach Bricker put out a team of which all Bristol-could truly be proud. The won and lost column might not have pleased everyone, but the boys performed like true sportsmen throughout the season. Due to the efforts of Coach Bricker and Assistant Coach McClelland the eleven was provided with the best equipment that any Tennessee High team has ever, had.

The sportsmanlike conduct and excellent spirit of the squad were so evident that many favorable comments were addressed to them. The school received a cup, presented by the approved officials of this region, for displaying the best sportsmanship in the Appalachian section this year. Other schools that have been the recipients of this award are Elizabethton, Jonesboro, Morristown, Kingsport, and Erwin.

This year the students and the sports lovers of the town backed the Vikings better than ever before. After the game with Kingsport, an Indian supporter remarked that Tennessee High had one of the best cheering sections and the cleanest playing teams in this section.

Unforgettable moments during the season: Furlow's broken field running against Erwinthe disappointment that came after the first loss of the season to Johnson City-Freddie Nidiffer getting knocked cold at Mountain City, with "Greyhound" Vance playing heads-up ball, and John Anderson displaying brilliant defensive work in the same game—the goal-line stand and touchdown pass in the Kingsport fray—the decisive victory over Virginia, which was well earned in freezing weather.


Wood-Proved apt understudy for tackles. Played "heads-up" and was one of the most willing workers on the squad.
