




# MAROON & WHITE

# ATHLETICS



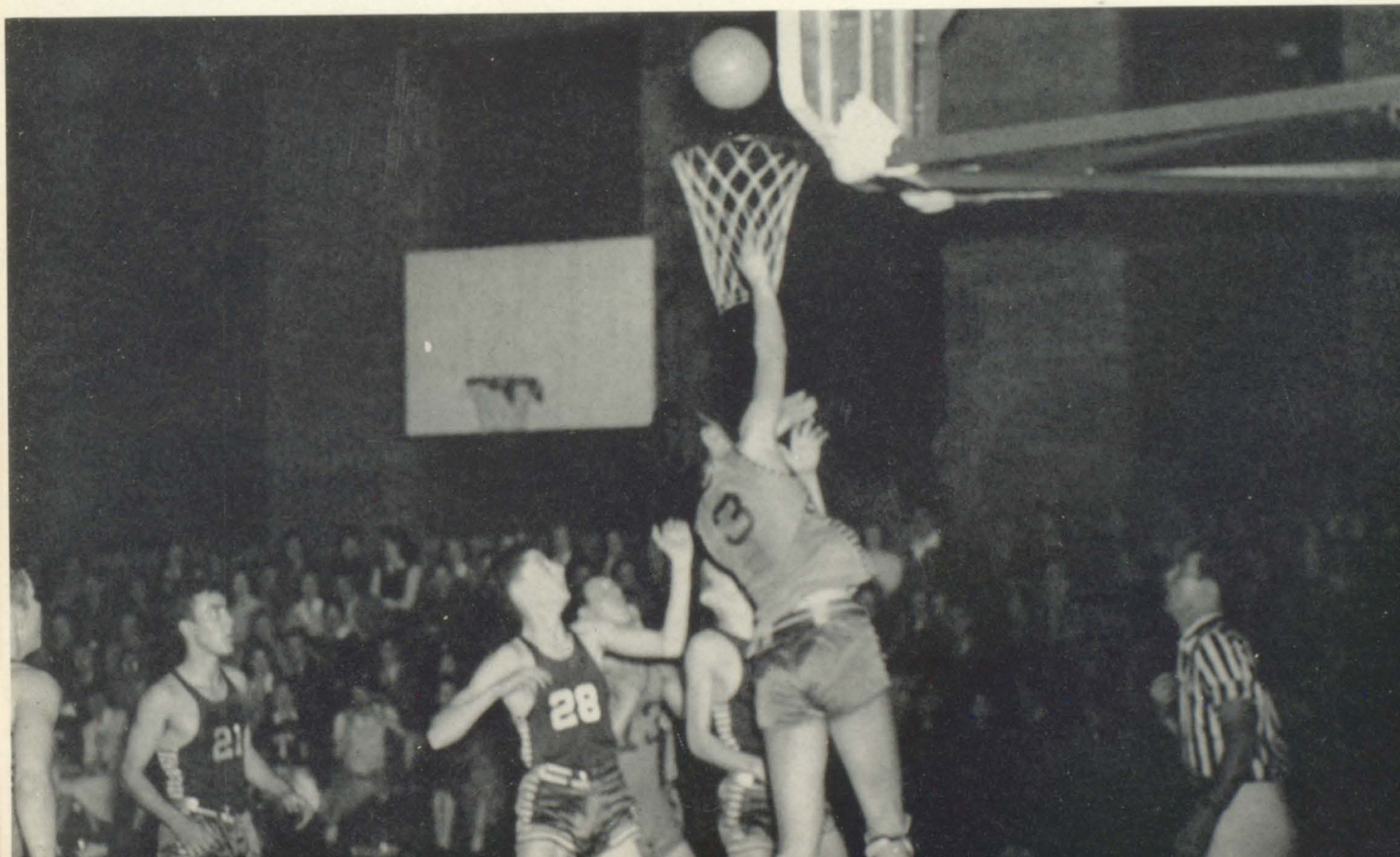
