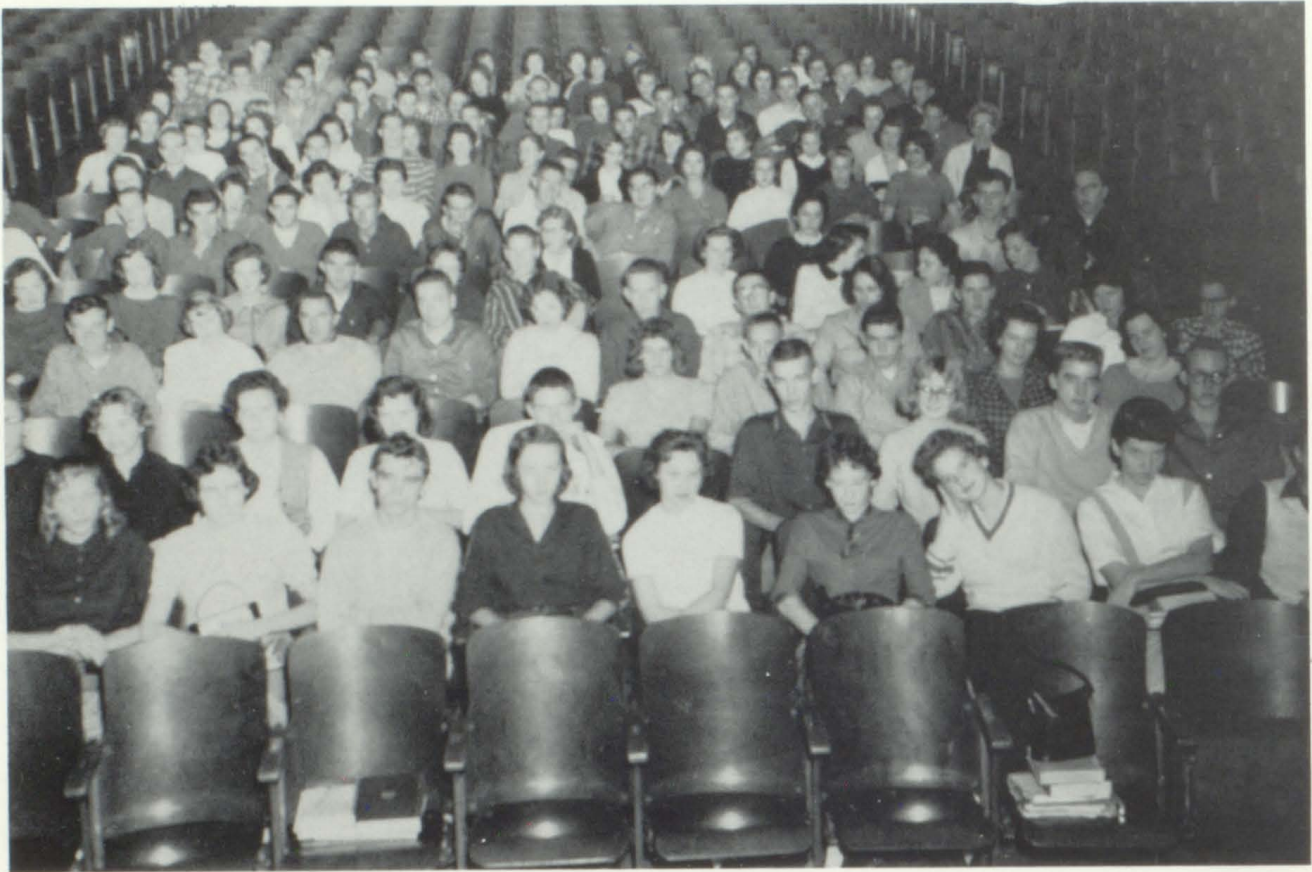
FOREWORD

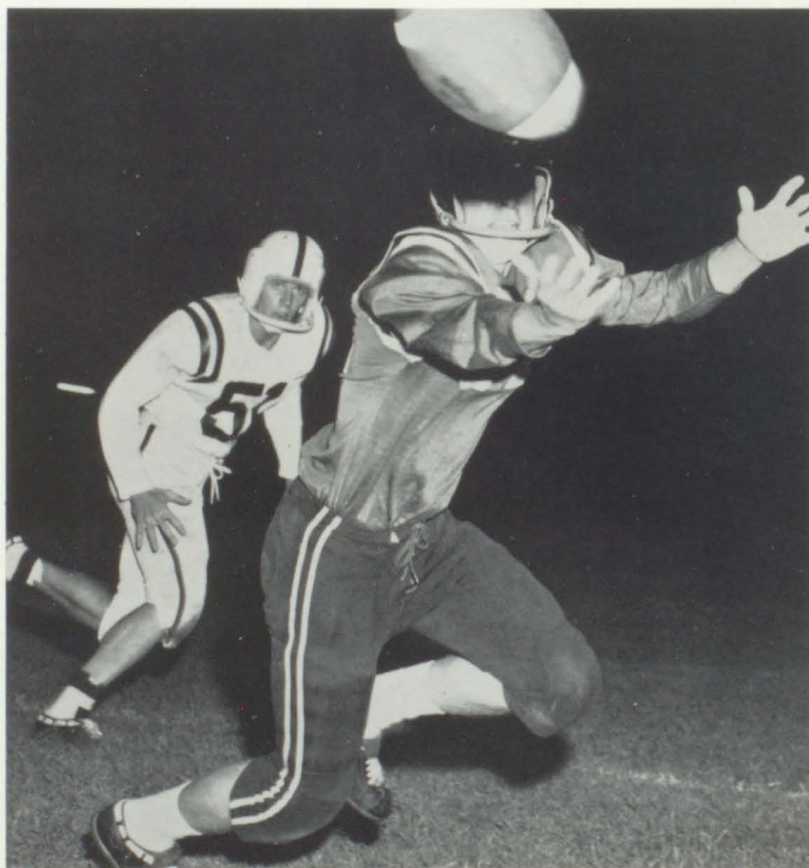

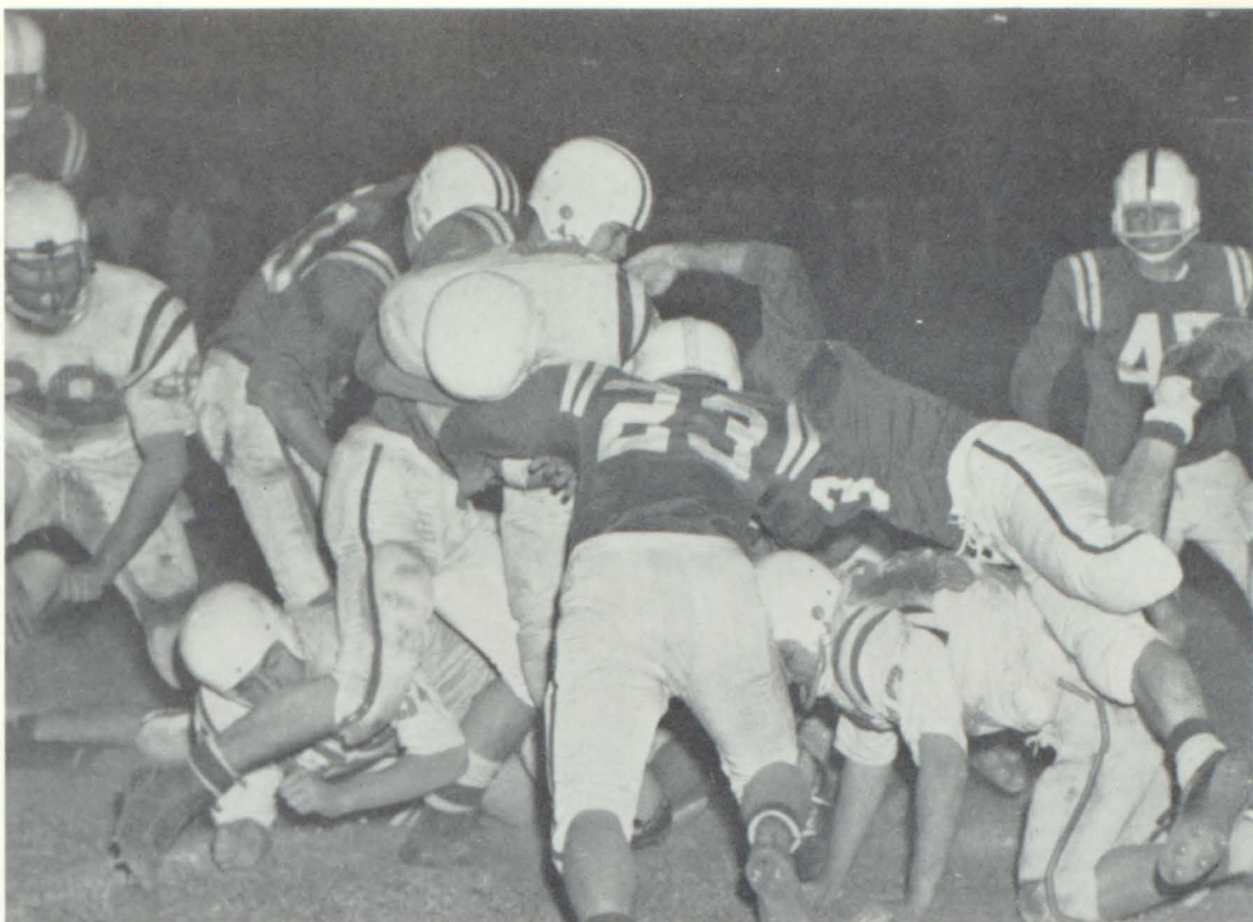
