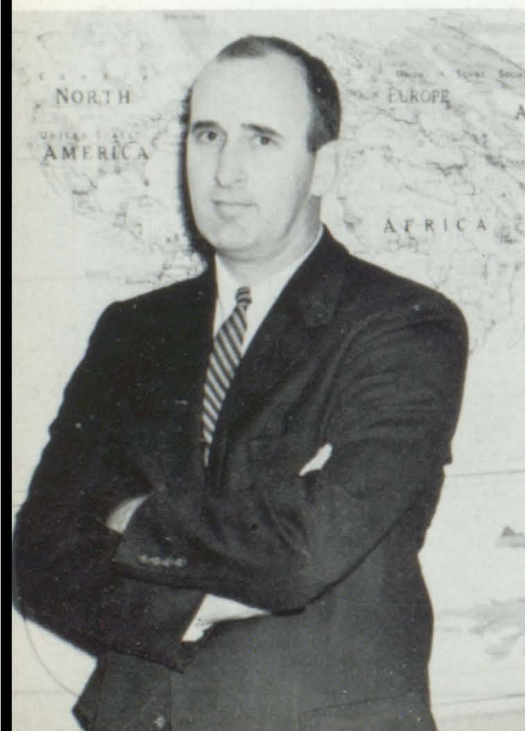
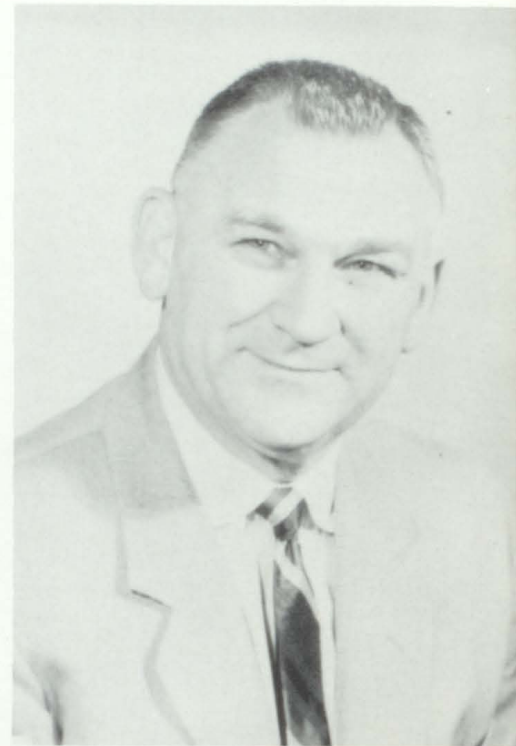


SUPERINTENDENT

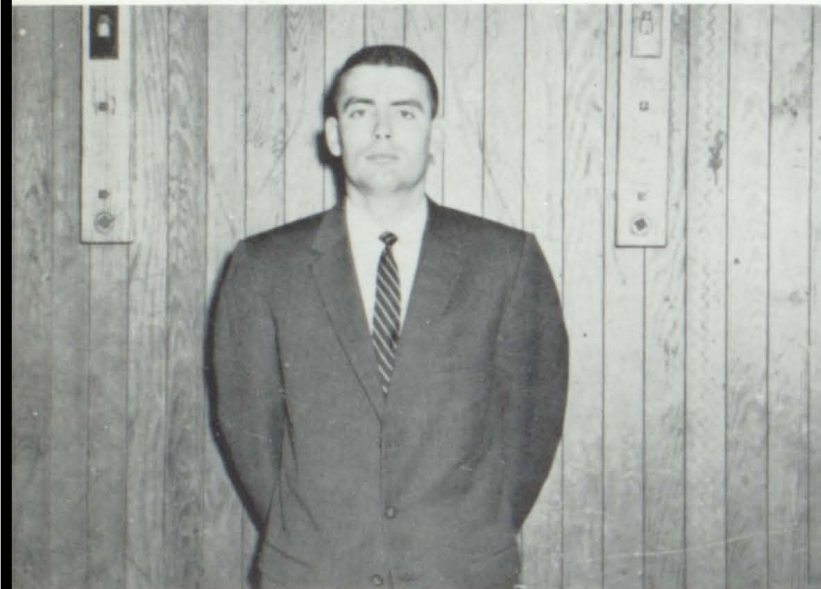

FOOTBALL 1959 1960

The Viking team of 1959 saw football reach its greatest peak in the history of Tennessee High School. Winning ten of eleven games--the City Championship---the Exchange Bowl in Kingsport---the 1959 team displayed all the qualities of great athletes. Not only were they outstanding as athletes, they were gentlemen and scholars as well. Their team spirit, their attitude both on and off the field was such that the school and community could be very proud to be represented by this fine group. They set standards which future teams may well strive to match.

Individual honors were garnered by Randy Robinett and Joe Garrett who were selected on the All-State first and second team respectively. Howard Garrett was chosen the most valuable player and his brother Joe came in for a second honor when he won the coveted King Trophy.

Coach Powers, Coach Keller, and Coach Bowdoin can always remember with pride the great team they guided to victory.

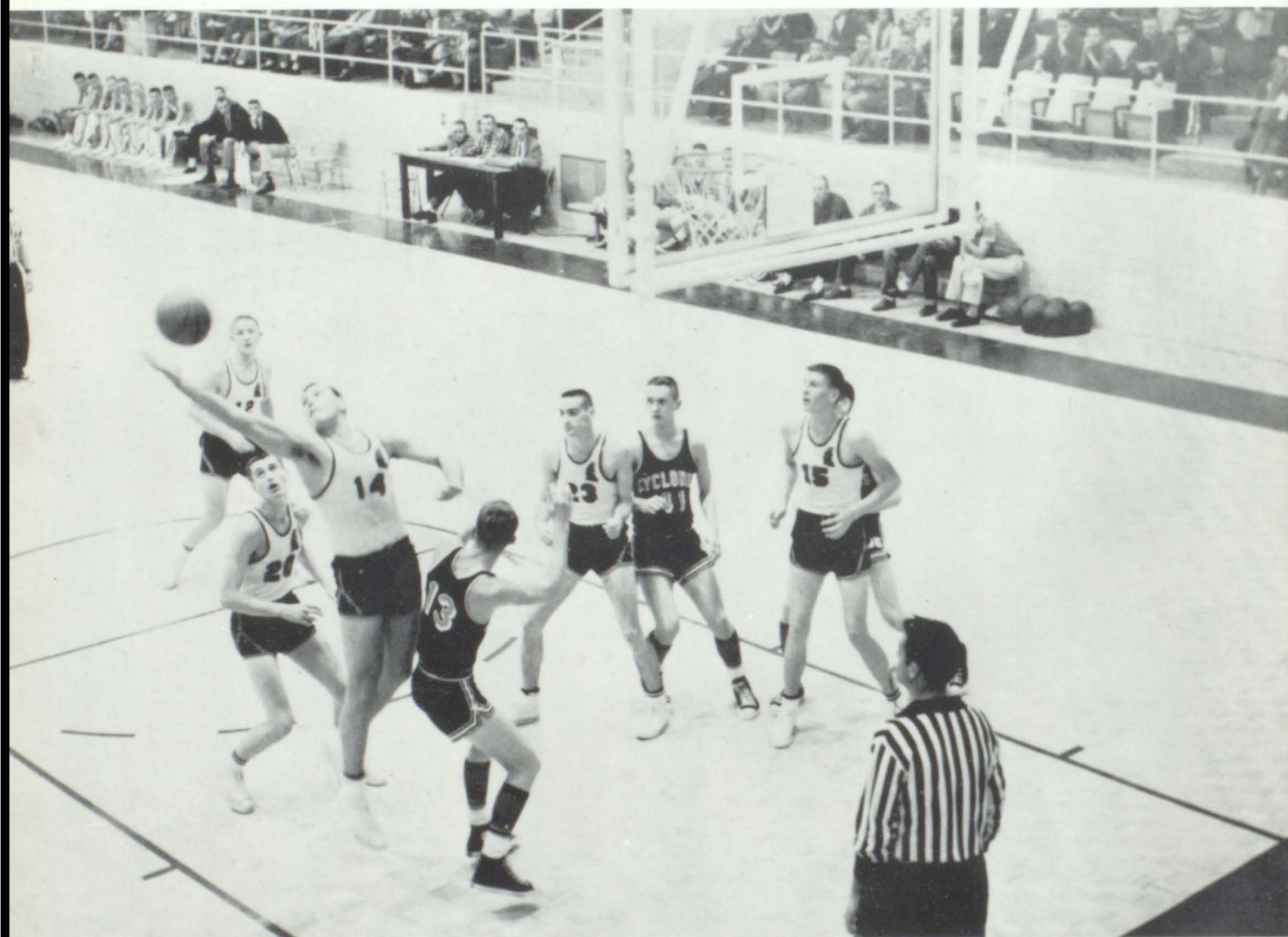

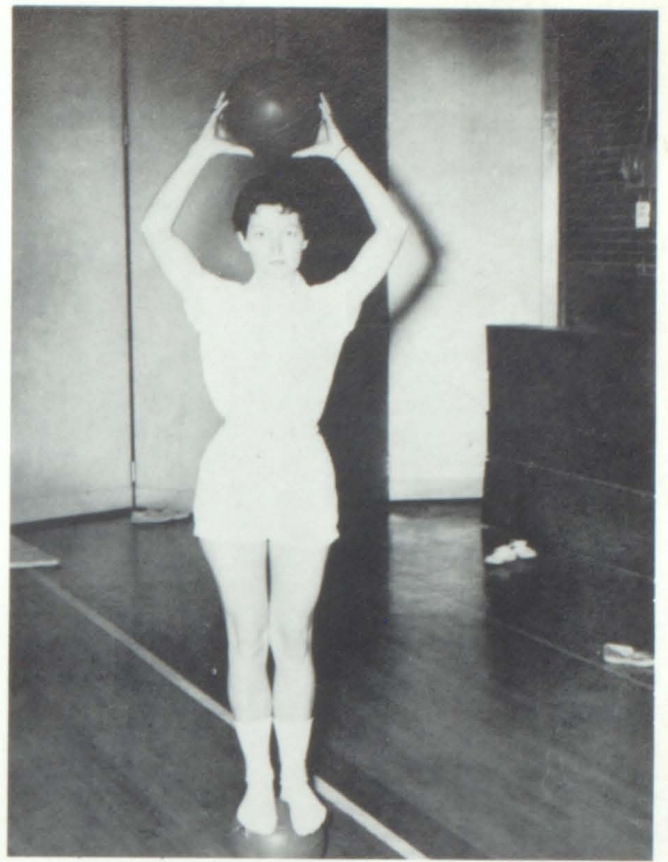

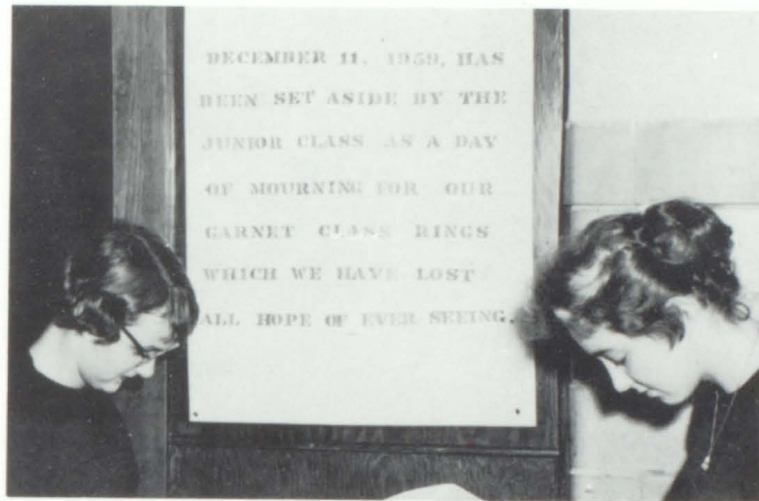

TENNESSEE HIGH CHORUS

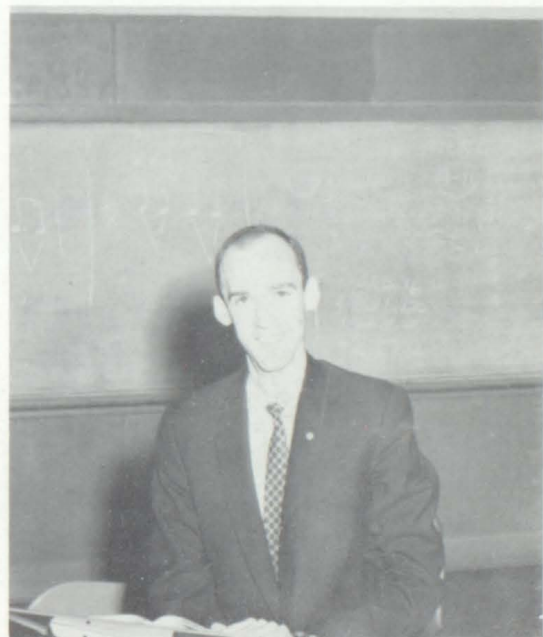
The Tennessee High Chorus is under the direction of Mr. Howard Nicar. It is composed of students from the junior and senior classes.

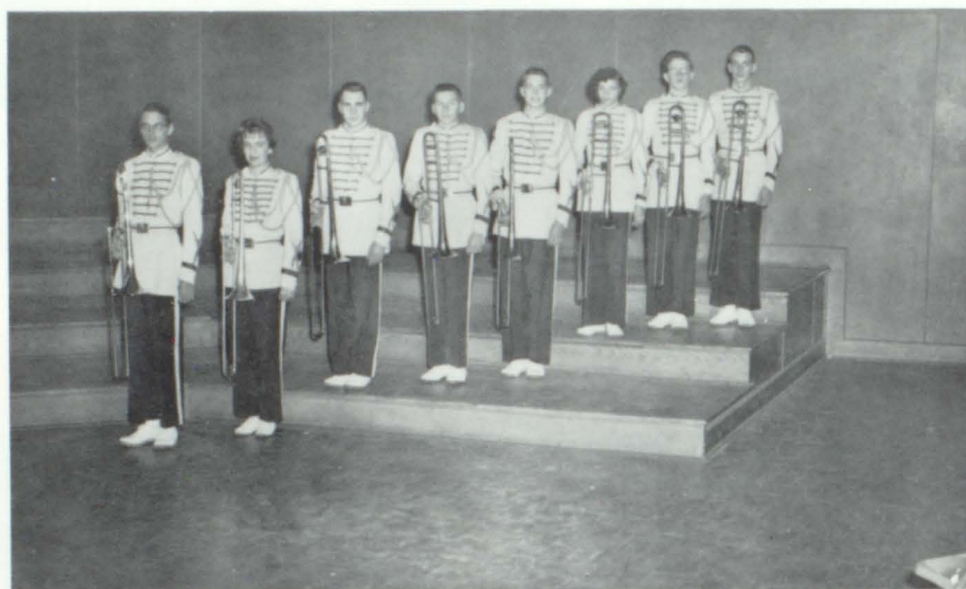

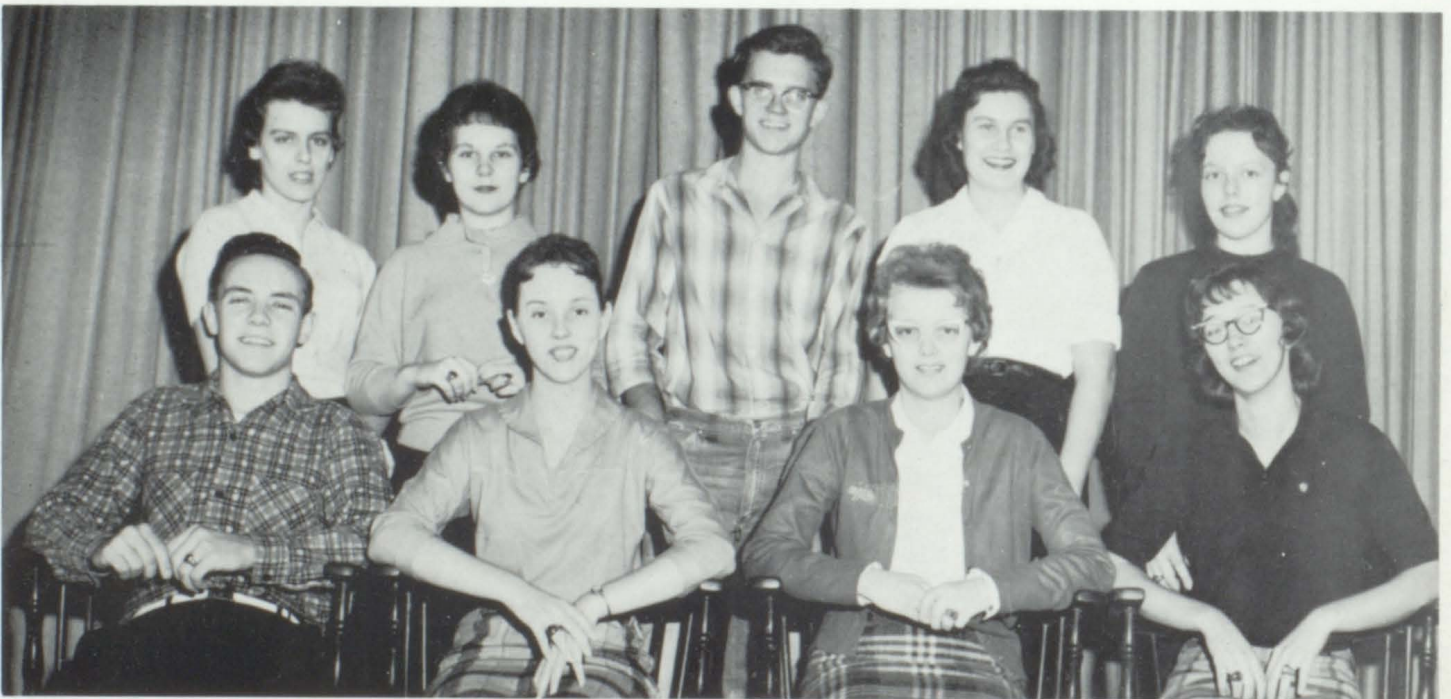

In 1934 the name "Vikings" was selected for our athletic Warriors. This created a great need for a uniform class ring. Charles J. Hawkins, a student at Tennessee High, designed the present class ring which was first worn by the class of 1936.

In a letter to the editors of the 1957 Cadmea. Mr. Hawkins writes:



"The old school building was chosen for historical and sentimental reasons; its silhouette to always remind us of fond and cherished memories in school days.

The Viking standing in the bow of his ship symbolizes the valor and fighting spirit of our teams and scans the horizon for new fields of conquest and endeavor. The size and ruggedness of the ring depicts the strength and growth both physically and mentally. Our identification encircling the stone adds a final touch for beauty and richness of character."



From Class Night ceremonies we get the following ideas:

The axes and rods symbolize the effort, power, and strength necessary to enforce the laws for the cause of justice, right, and high ideals.

The shield stands for the honor of the school.

The four-leaf clovers are symbols to honor the first class to wear the ring with the present design. They are also tokens of luck for the seniors graduating to new realms of life.



The Class of 1961 established the tradition of choosing the garnet as the stone for the Class Ring.

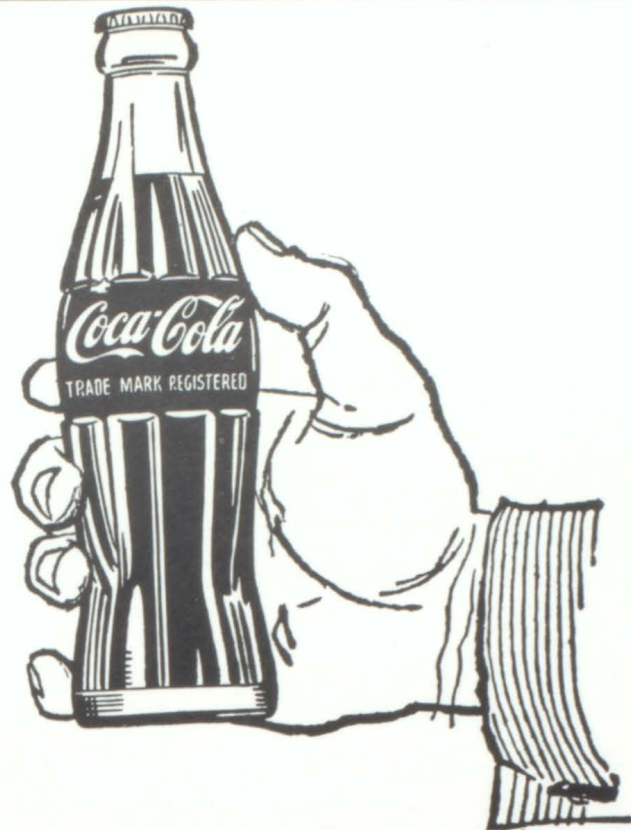

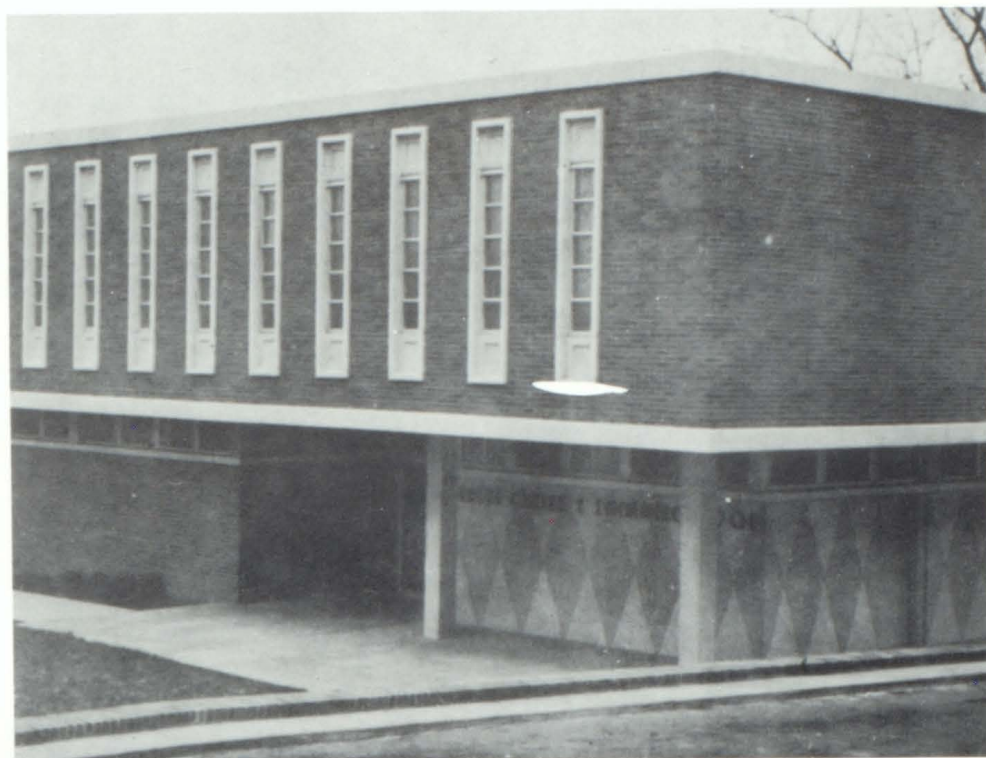

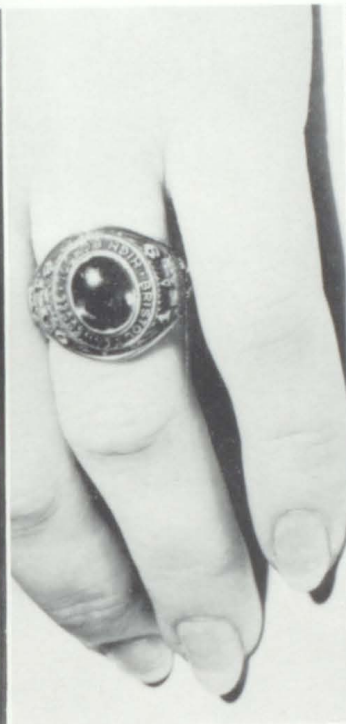
