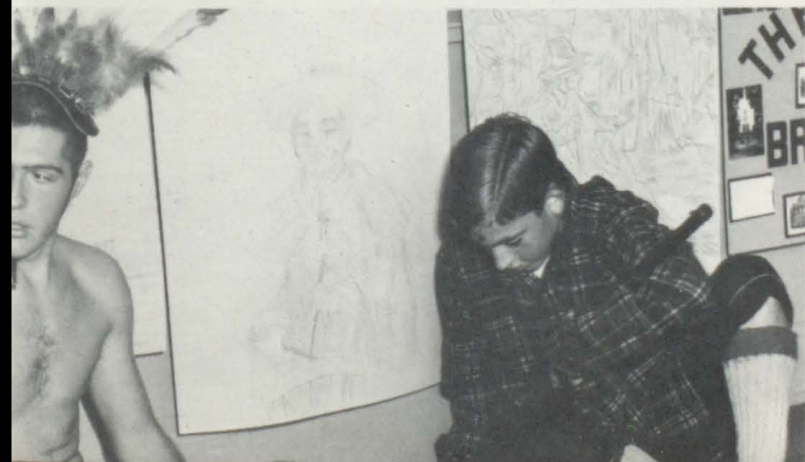

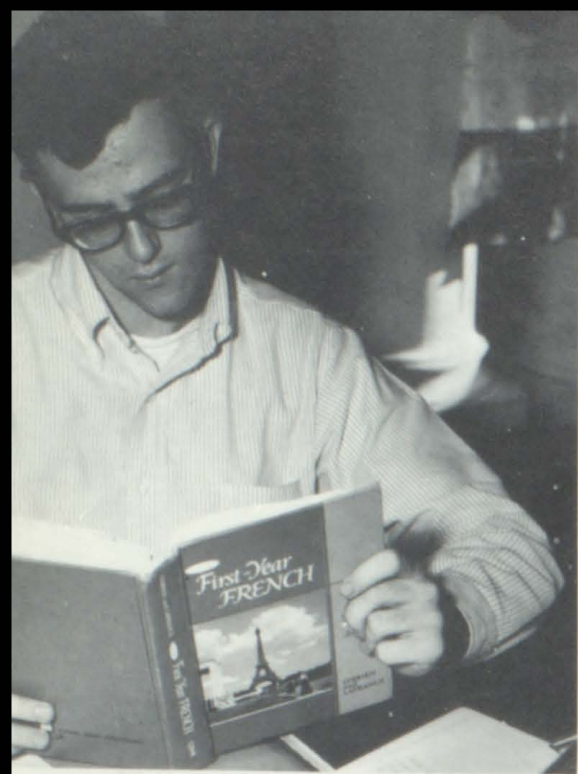
When our rings finally arrived—just in time for Christmas—everyone was excited and proud, for we realized that they represented our class and our school.

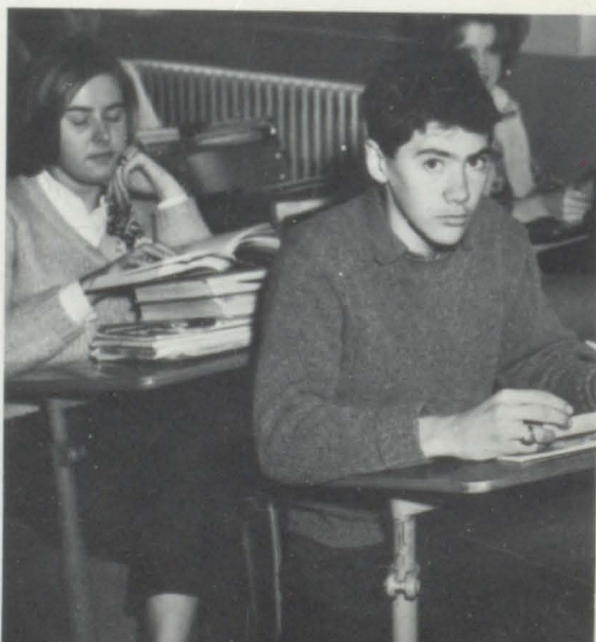

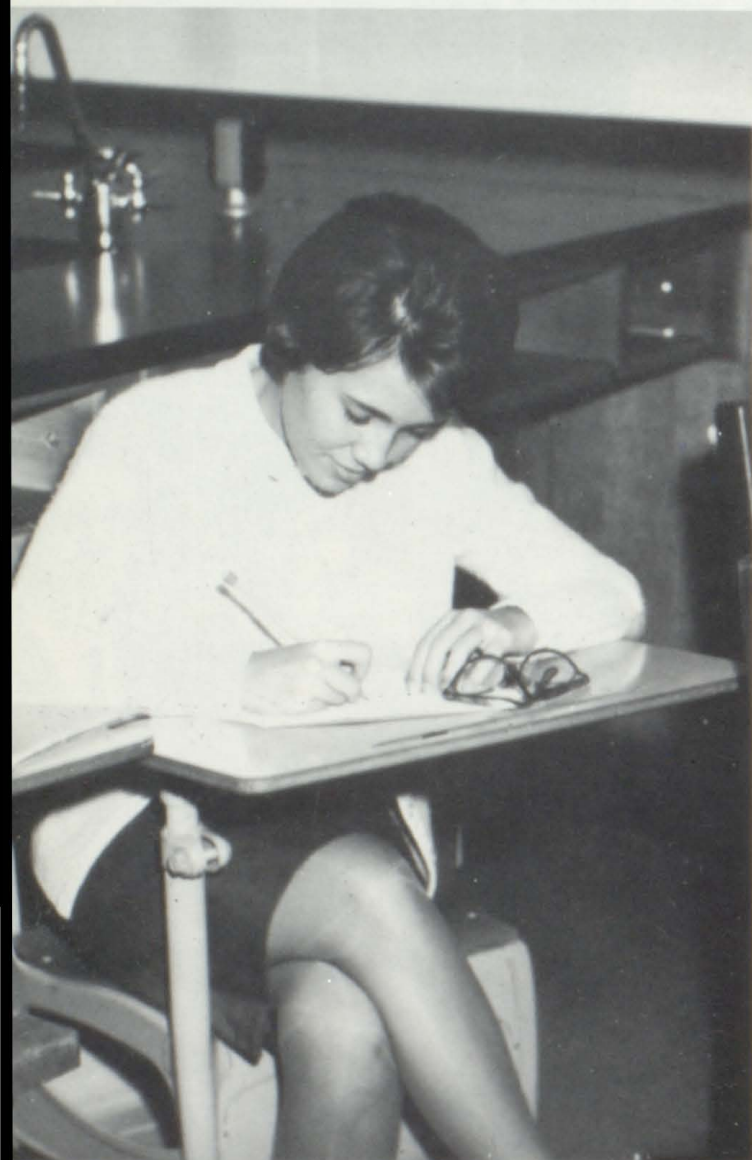

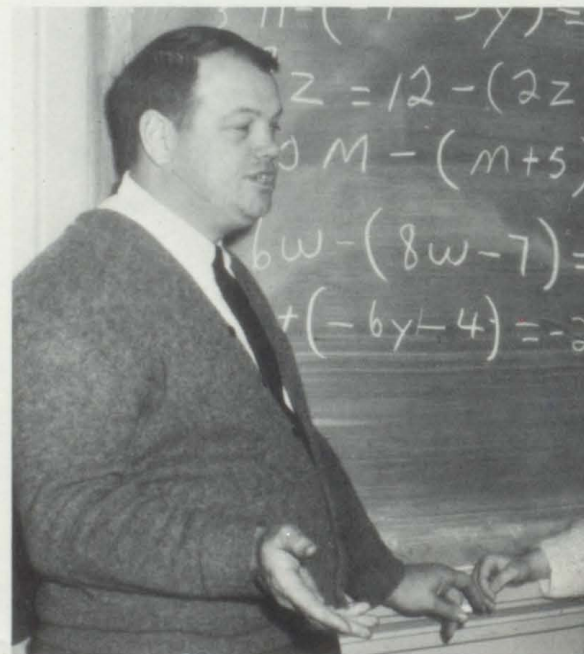

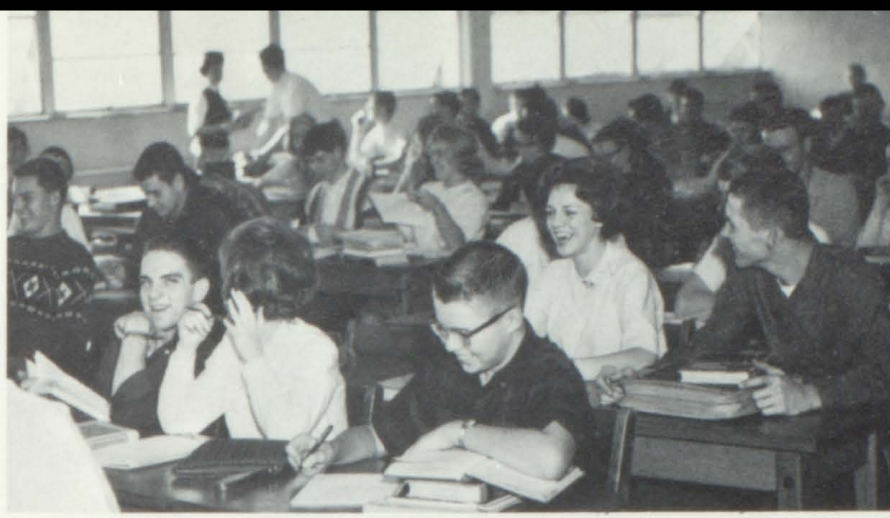

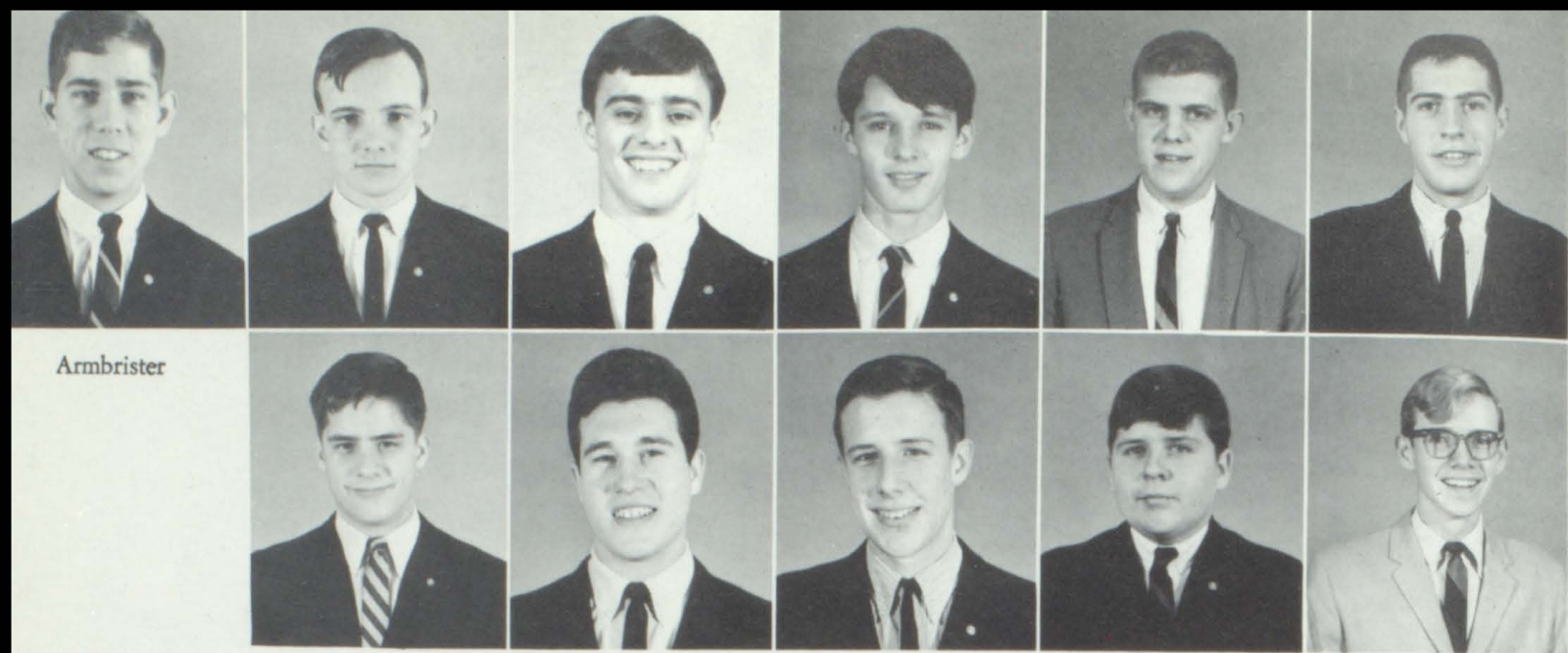

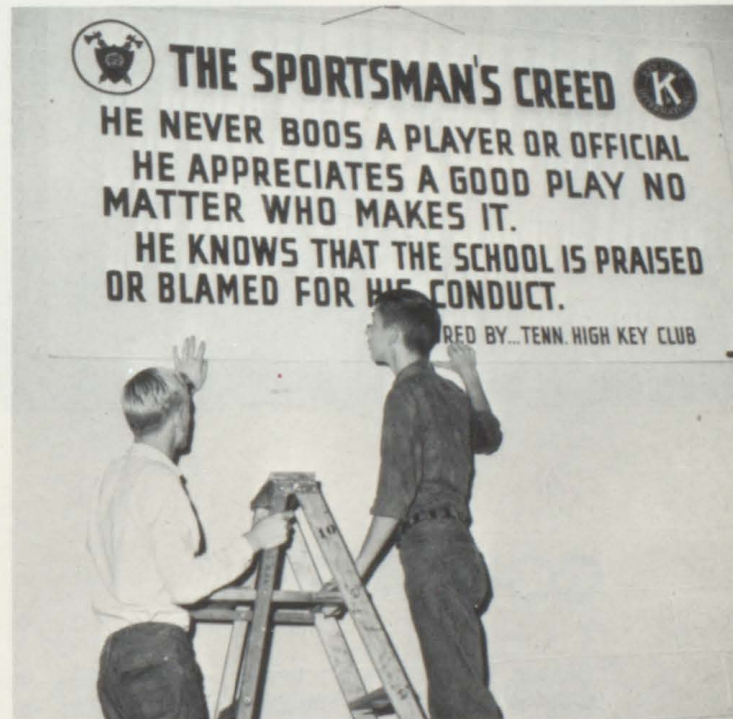

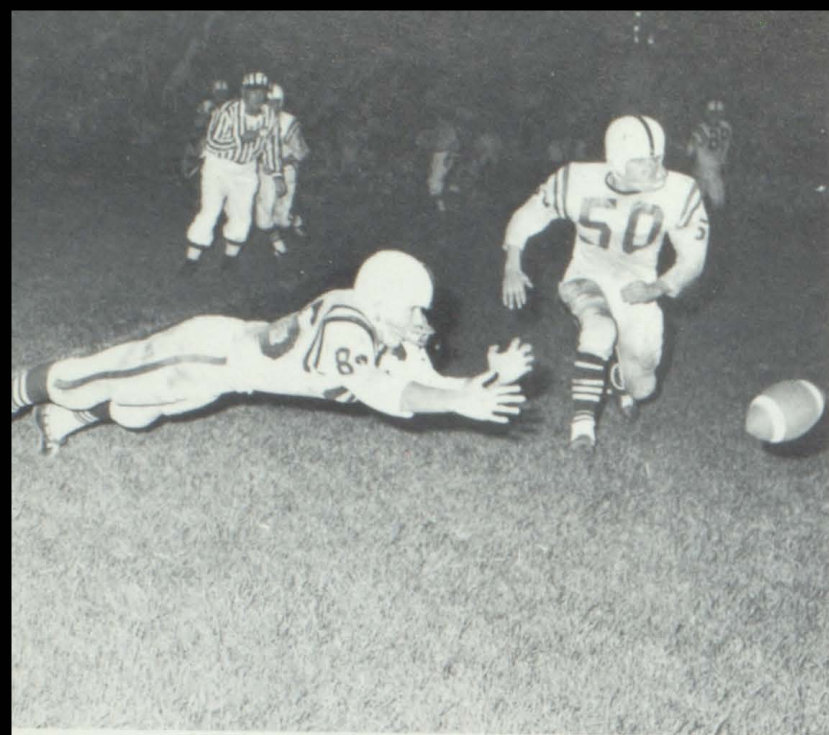

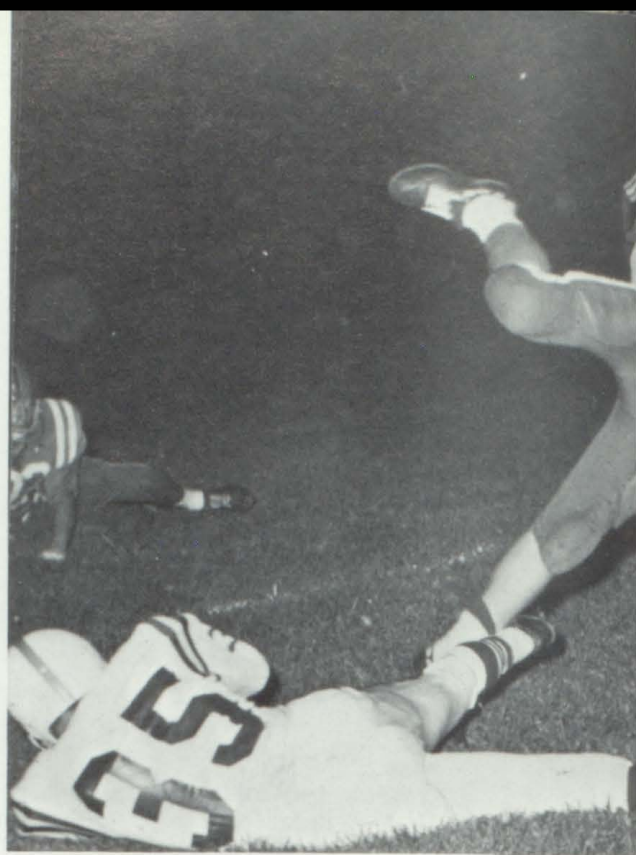

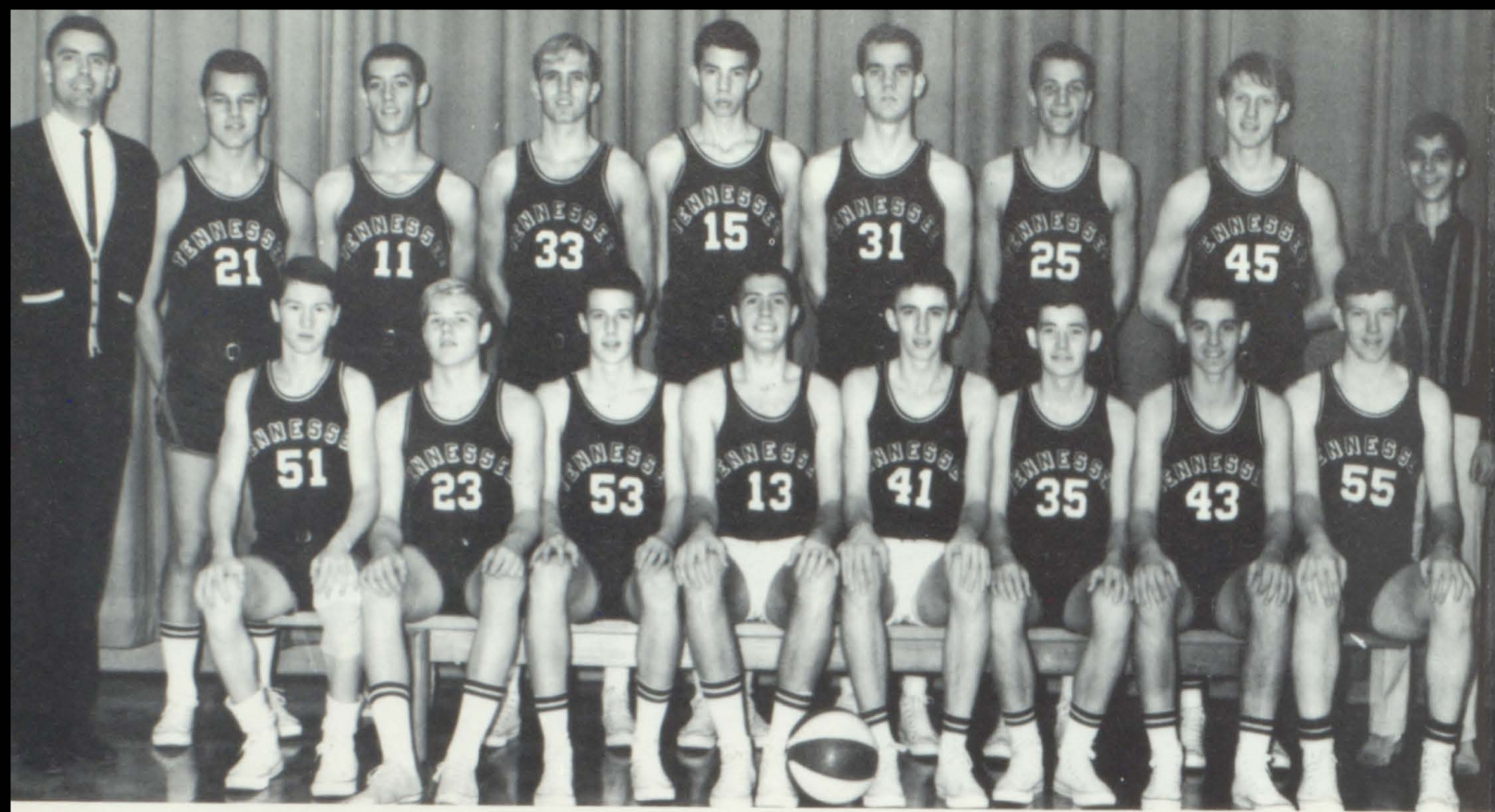

BASKETBALL

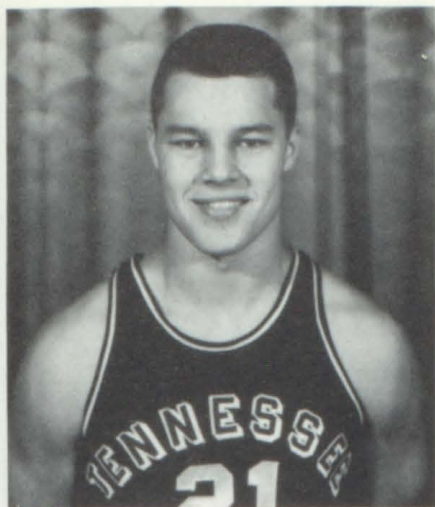

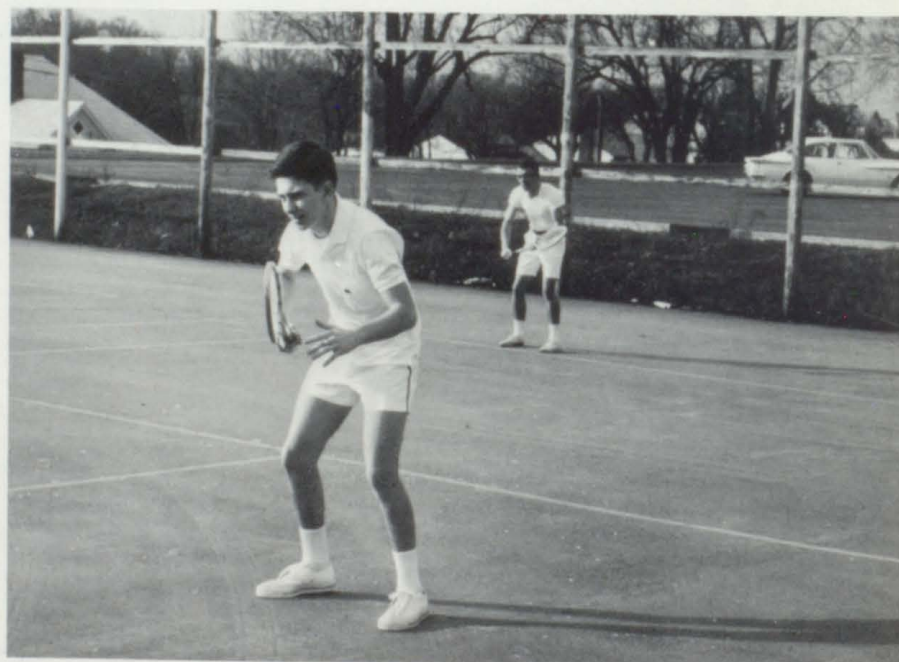
