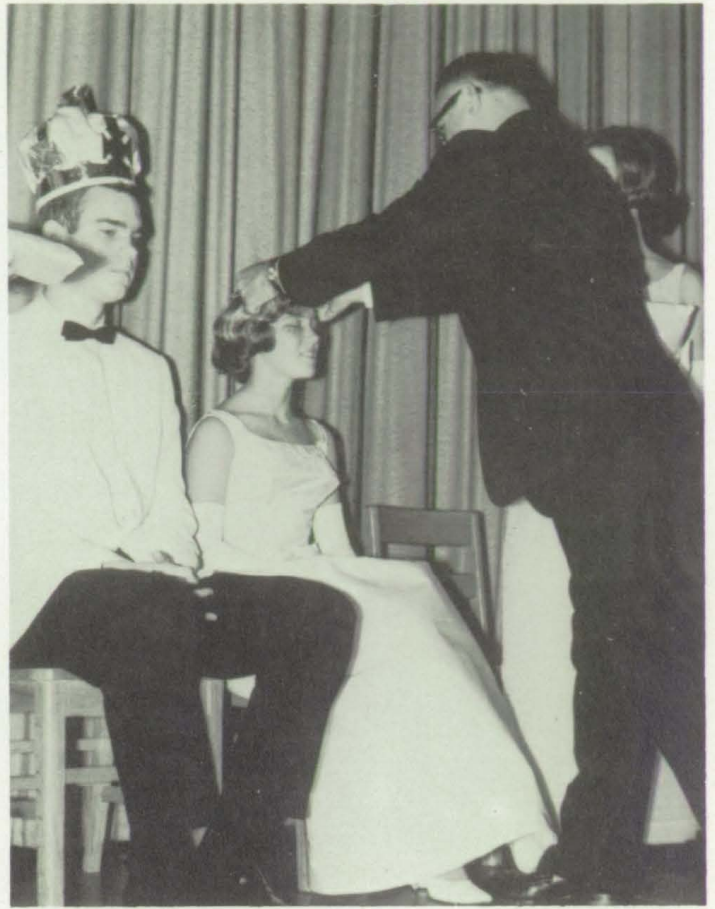

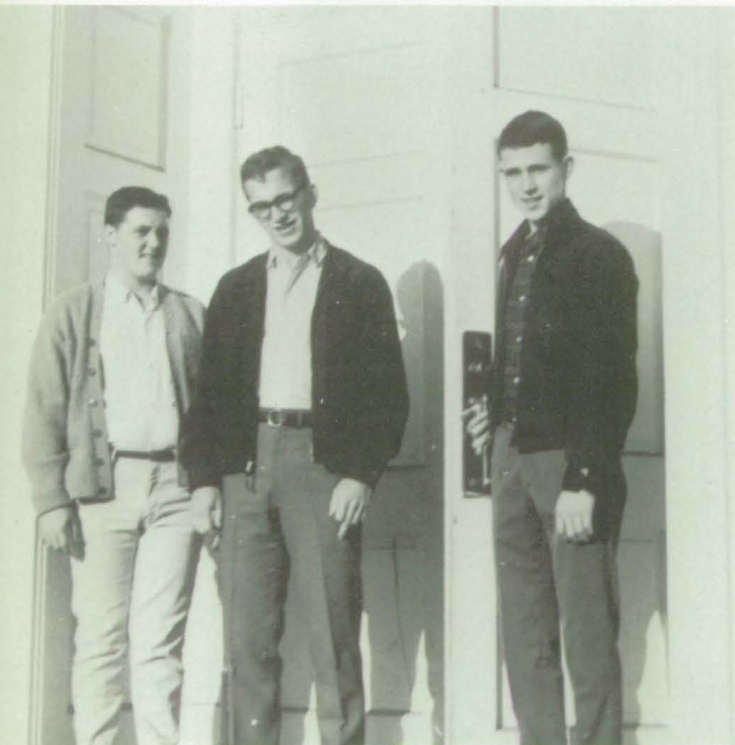
## Vikings Post Close To Same Record As Last Year

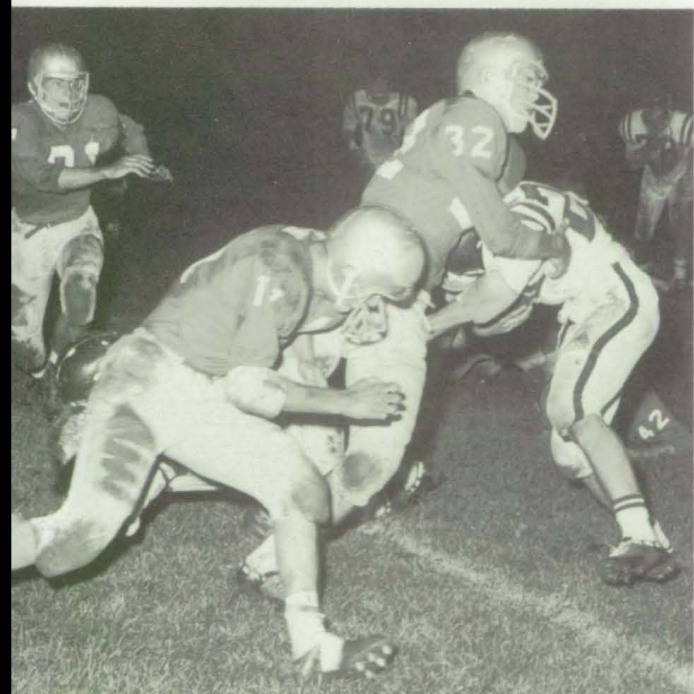

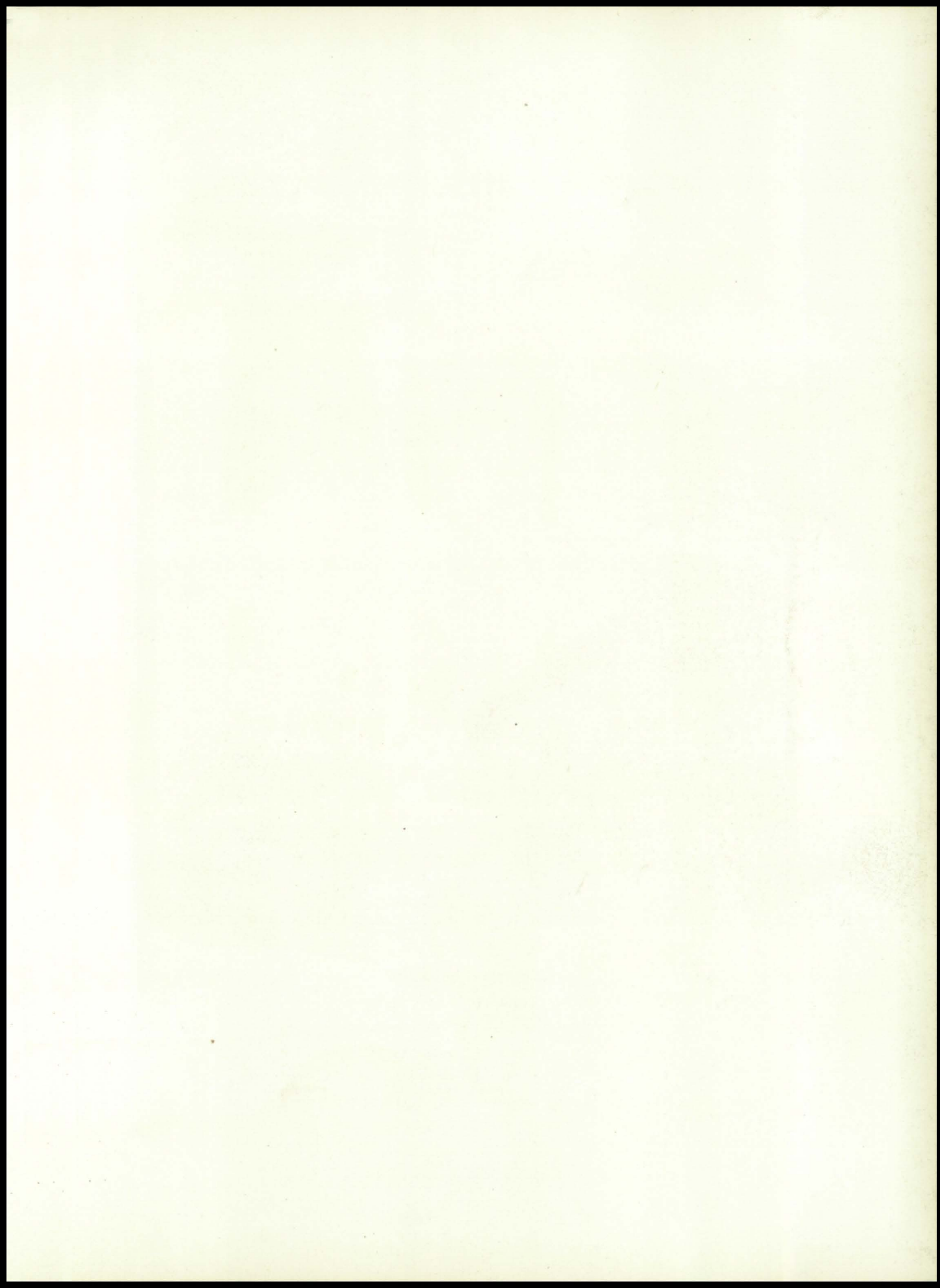
RETROSPECT\*
