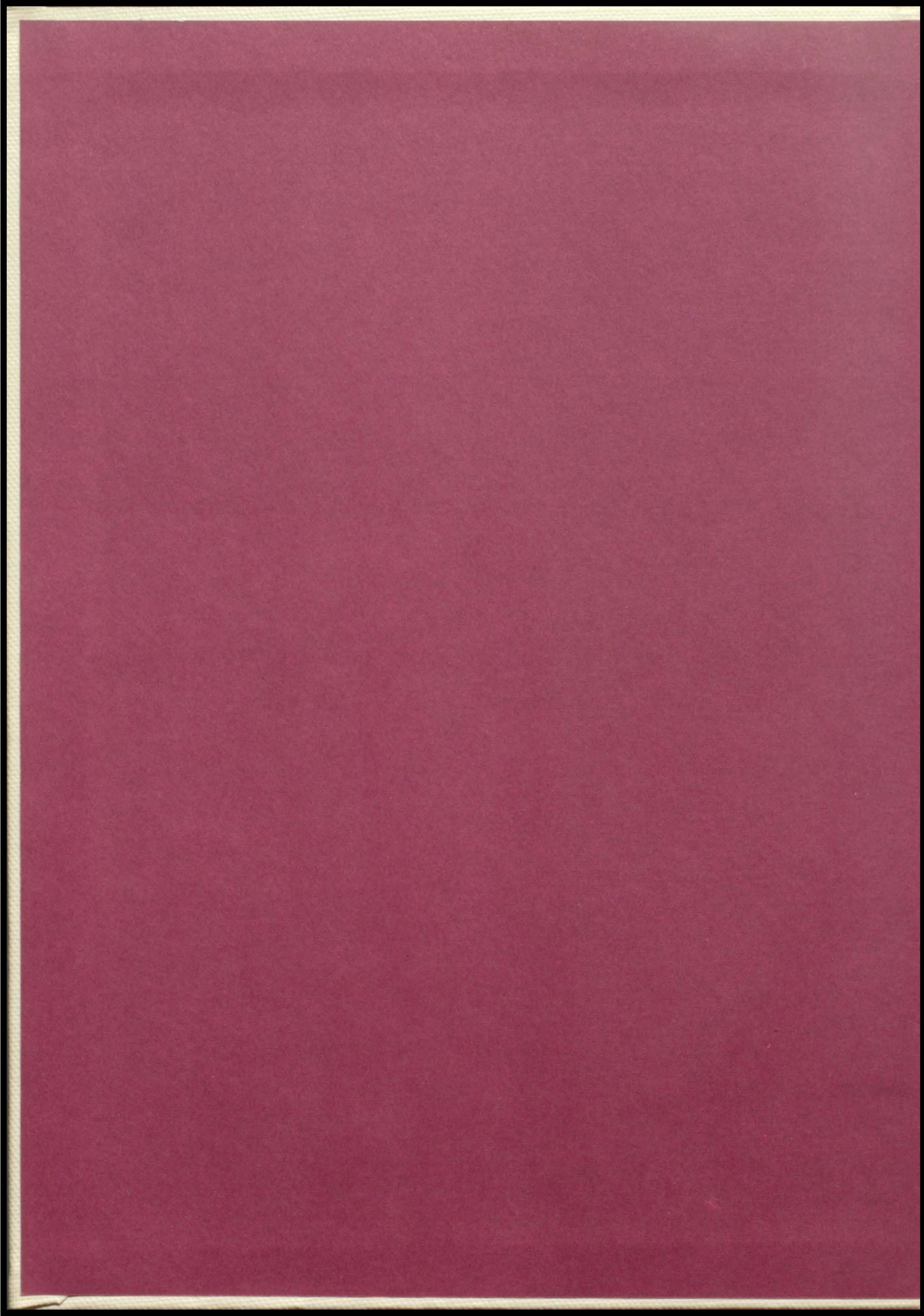
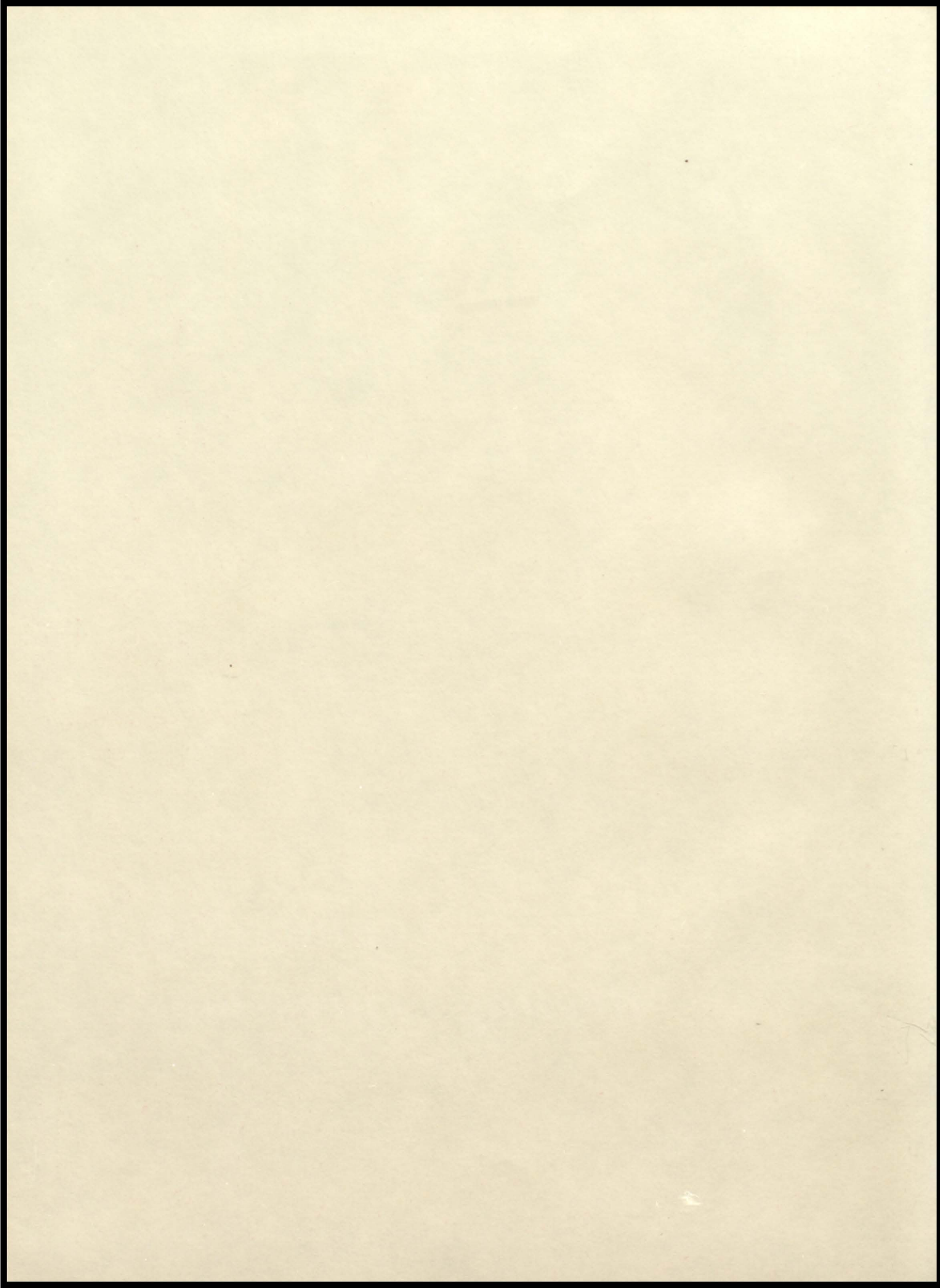

knowing oneself.

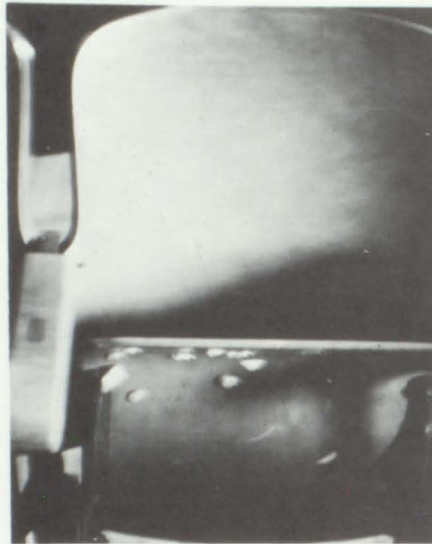


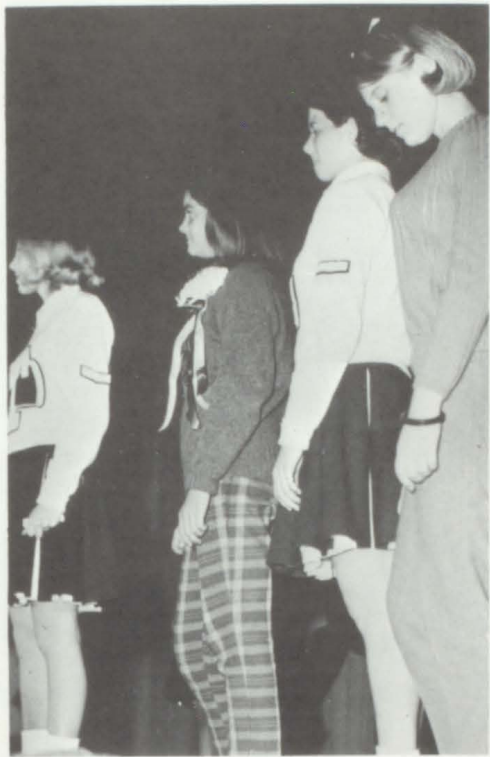

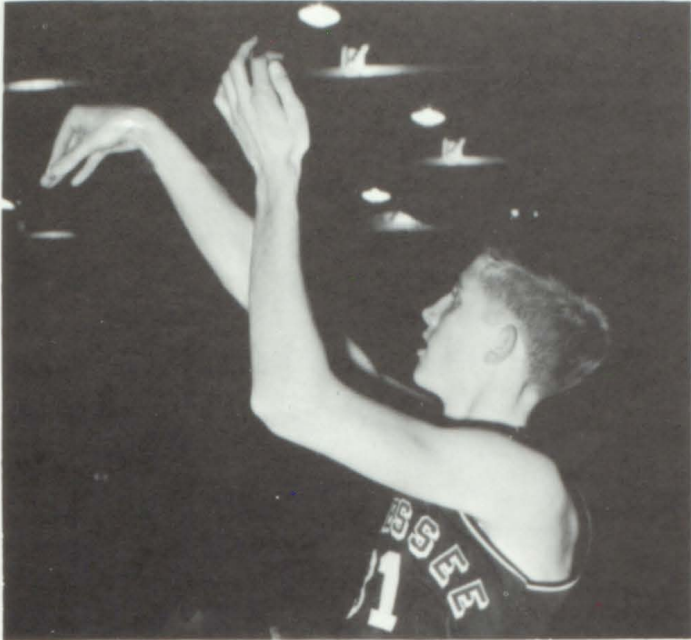

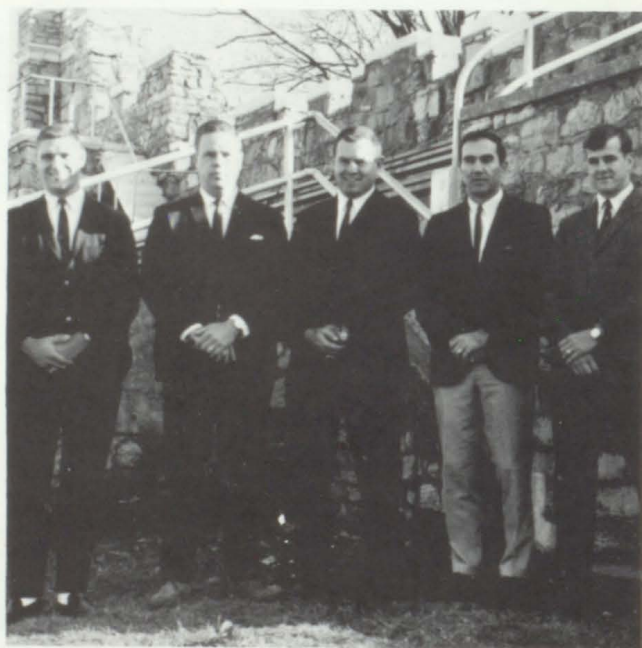
